Kids, Did you know:

- The community is on Bear Island in the middle of the Lake Temagami
- They have 689 registered band members and 221 members live on the reserve
- The language spoken is Ojibway
- Temagami (Te-mee-ay-gaming) translates to Deep Water
- Daki Menan translates to My Land of Teme-Augama People unceded Indian land in north-eastern Ontario
- Community Days are held in late summer each year, this is where the community comes together with friends and family to celebrate their culture, their community

History:

They have been living well in their traditional territory for thousands and thousands of years. The community is right in the heart of the Temagami wilderness. Temagami has deep clear lakes, and ancient rocks. They are part of the Anishinaabe community and Bear Island is only a small part of the Anishinaabe's Nindakiiminan which includes over ten thousand kilometers of land in the area.
