Kids, Did you know:

- The community is in the Province of Quebec, about 80 kilometers west of North Bay, Ontario
- The languages spoken are Algonquin, and English; the Eagle Village Algonquins speak a Northern Algonquin dialect
- On National Aboriginal Day on June 21, 2014, three communities Eagle Village First Nation, Town of Témiscaming and Municipality of Kipawa celebrated Algonquin culture and signed a three-way Friendship Accord, making their promise to cooperate with each other
- Eagle Village First Nation, also called Kipawa, is a popular tourism destination for fishing
- Members of the community still practice their traditional ways, speak their language and perform ceremonies

History:

The territory of this Algonquin community goes by the name of Eagle Village First Nation-Kipawa, also known by the name of Kebaowek. The name Kipawa comes from the Cree word kipa-kowé and the Algonquin word kébaоек, which both mean enclosed or locked up, and refers to the name of a lake.
